Budget News

On March 30, 2020, Governor Cuomo issued Executive Order 202.13 which impacted schools in several ways.

All school board elections and associated budget votes were postponed until June 1, 2020 at the earliest, and are subject to further directives including future delays.

As a result, the May 19 budget vote, the May 5 Public Hearing and the May 4 Meet the Candidate have been canceled. At this time, no dates have been set for these events.

OMS named 2020 Essential Elements School to Watch

BCSD is proud to announce that A.D. Oliver Middle School (OMS) has been designated by the NYS Education Department as a 2020 Essential Elements School to Watch. The NYS Middle School Association and the Essential Elements Schools to Watch leadership team chose OMS in recognition of the continued commitment to enhancing the school program and practices.

After three years of collaboration with multiple stakeholders, OMS finalized and submitted a 200-page application to solicit this prestigious designation. The team worked to identify strengths within the middle school and areas in need of improvement. Together, they used the evidence collected to update and align the building's strategic plan and set targeted focus areas.

In December, OMS hosted a site visit from the NYS Essential Elements State Committee that included visits to classrooms and meetings with all stakeholders including district and building administration, board of education members, staff, students and families.

According to the NYS Education Department, the educational program developed by OMS is considered a "model program" that is consistent with the Regents Policy Statement on Middle Level Education, the Essential Elements of a Standards Focused Middle Level School and the National Forum's Schools to Watch criteria.

"This process has allowed us to explore all that we offer in our school so that we can continue to provide the best

opportunities and programs," said OMS Principal Jerrod Roberts. "Our students, staff and community should be very proud of this designation, as it was a true collaboration and demonstrates Oliver's dedication to excellence and continuous improvement."

OMS will be formally recognized and honored as a State and National School to Watch at the NYS Middle School Association conference in Albany and the National Schools to Watch Conference in Washington, DC.

Mr. Broughton has been teaching at BCSD since 2005. He currently oversees the enrichment program at Fred W. Hill School, providing students with fun and exciting ways to learn. "It feels amazing, very humbling. There's a lot of people behind the scenes that have helped in winning this award," says Mr. Broughton. "From the Board of Education supporting endeavors to central office and administration; it's truly amazing. I couldn't ask for a better district and community to work for."

Summer Literacy Program

It is widely understood that, on average, students lose academic ground during the summer, a phenomenon frequently referred to as summer learning loss or summer slide. Understanding this, Brockport Central School District is once again excited to announce the Summer Literacy Program. Students in grades K – 6, receiving Academic Intervention Services, will be given the opportunity to attend this program between July 13 - August 6, 2020, at the Fred Hill Elementary School. And...no Fridays!

Students and teachers love this program! Teachers participate in professional development two days per week and collaborate with colleagues as they focus on increasing their pedagogical expertise. Students get to engage as learners in a small group setting where they participate in the Readers and Writers Workshop.

Pioneered by Lucy Calkins and her TCRWP colleagues, and refined over decades of research and piloting with thousands of teachers, reading and writing workshops are deliberately designed to offer a simple and predictable environment. Teachers can focus on the complex work of observing students' progress and teaching to their needs.

- Each session begins with a mini-lesson presented by the teacher.
- The mini-session ends with the kids doing their own independent work.
- As students work, the teacher confers with them and leads small groups.
- During independent work time the teacher stands and delivers a mid-workshop teaching point.
- The workshop ends with a sharing of ideas.

In addition, students receive 30 minutes of word work/skill block where they focus on basic foundational skills such as grammar, spelling, phonics and language conventions. Resource guides have been created by the Office of Instruction and are designed to ensure the growth of students and provide a strong core instructional program.

Welcome to Brockport's Continuing Education program! The mission of our program is to offer continued learning opportunities that meet the needs and interests of our community.



Refunds

If you join a class after the scheduled start date, the tuition will be the same amount. Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel, and on the road as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old by July 6, 2020 and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing Five-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

Classroom instruction: Students must attend all 16 sessions of classroom instruction in the high school room 192. The loan of a text is included in the class fee.

Richard Barrett – Session II – Room 192

Students must have the following for theory class:

- Permit/license
- New York State Driver Manual

Driving groups: will start and end at the high school pool door (east side) parking lot. ALL students must attend ALL classroom and road classes to receive a certificate (MV285). Should a make-up driving class be requested by a student due to extenuating circumstances, they will be scheduled at the discretion of the instructor. Scheduling of or transportation to the road test are not included. Parents or other qualified adults should plan to devote time for enrolled students to practice the skills learned in this class. Only experience and good judgment makes a safe driver. A current NYS Learner's Permit must be brought to all classes.

Brockport eighth-grade student, Desi Dubois, is one of the best racewalkers in the state. The OMS student races for the BHS Varsity Indoor Track team. Desi qualified to compete at the NYS Track and Field Championships in Staten Island, where she placed ninth with a time of 7:17:47. Her personal record in the 1500-meter racewalk is 7:15:68.



Desi learned more about racewalking from her grandfather, John Izzo (pictured above with Desi). As a year-round runner, Desi was interested in racewalking to switch things up during the indoor season. She was familiar with racewalking through her mother, Christina Dubois, who was a national high school champion in the event.

Desi races cross country and participates in outdoor track and field. She says that running gives her a good base for the racewalking season and helps her prepare. People are often shocked to learn what it takes to racewalk. There are three rules of racewalking: always have contact with the ground, do not bend your knees when moving through to walk and there has to be a moment of double contact with each step.

So, what's next for Desi? The eighth grader says she is going to see where racewalking takes her in high school and then continue to compete in college, if she decides to take that route. She is, after all, still 13 years old!
