Digital Safety Program

Brockport CSD partnered with the Monique Burr Foundation to implement a comprehensive, research-based prevention program on digital citizenship.



All middle school students received two engaging, age and developmentally appropriate classroom lessons that educated and empowered them to prevent, recognize and respond appropriately to bullying, cyberbullying, child abuse, relationship abuse, digital abuse and other digital dangers. OMS counselors, Heather Sealfon and Marissa Cavalieri, are trained facilitators of the MBF prevention program and collaborated with the OMS Health teachers to implement this program.

Digital Safety Tips:

- Start early teaching your child about digital safety. Prevention is the key to safety in the current digital culture.
- Keep all computers, games and other digital devices in a common area in the house.
- Establish rules and guidelines for your child regarding the length of time they are allowed on the computer and other digital devices and the use of age-appropriate, approved websites and apps.

- Learn more about the sites and apps your child is using, and read the terms and conditions before agreeing to their use.
- Monitor your child's online accounts and review your child's computer, cell phone, game use and history. Use the opportunities to teach them about potential digital dangers and digital safety.
- Teach your child about good digital citizenship and the importance of establishing a good digital reputation that will follow them into their future.
- Do not use digital shaming as a form of punishment.
- Be a positive role model for your child and demonstrate good digital behavior and citizenship.
- Learn more about digital dangers and digital safety to become educated and empowered to keep your child safer online and when using digital devices.

Research Projects at OMS

Seventh-grade team Delta students worked on a research project about the thirteen English Colonies. They collaborated with a partner to gather information about a colony that was assigned to them. Students used the research to create an advertisement for their colony that included basic information about the colony, with the goal of trying to encourage settlement. Delta students presented their projects on Flipgrid so that classmates were able to view the presentations and learn about the other colonies.



BHS Students Explore Careers in Construction

Brockport students taking multiple Technology courses had the opportunity to learn from professionals at the Annual Rochester Careers in Construction Day at the Monroe County Fleet Center.

Students tried their hand with equipment by bending pipes, soldering copper, hammering nails, laying brick and driving skid-steers, excavators and bucket lifts. Several students also designed and built their own bridge out of popsicle-sticks to compete for several awards. BHS students enjoyed their time exploring the field of construction.

This is the fifth year the District has brought students to the Careers in Construction Day. BHS Technology Teacher Richard Barrett was



accompanied on the trip by BHS Counselor David Messbauer. The two enjoy bringing students to the event each year, explaining how they do everything they can to give and show students a wide array of opportunities available after high school. "Each year, this event continues grow in scope and increases opportunities for our students to learn, talk with construction professionals and actively participate throughout the experience," said Barrett.



ART HIGHLIGHTS


Ceramic Creations

Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel and on the road, as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing Five-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education. The loan of a text is included in the class fee.

(Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class allowed.

Students must have the following for theory class:

- Permit/license
- NYS Driver Manual
- Notebook/folder
- Writing materials

Students must be prepared with the following for each car class:

- Permit/license
- Sunglasses are encouraged
- Appropriate footwear (i.e. no backless sandals)

Driving groups: will start and end at the east-side (pool) parking lot of the high school. Driving classes may be rescheduled at the instructor's discretion due to inclement weather. Should a makeup driving class be requested by a student due to extenuating circumstances, the instructor will reschedule at his discretion. Driving groups may be rescheduled to place four drivers in each time block. Every effort will be made to accommodate rescheduling conflicts. However, the instructor reserves the right to create a schedule that is most effective in terms of number of students scheduled for each driving group. Scheduling of, or transportation to, the road test are not included. Parents or other qualified adults should plan to devote time for enrolled students to practice the skills learned in this class. Only experience and good judgment will make a safe driver. A current NYS Learner's Permit must be brought to all classes.

Registration directions: send your payment, completed registration form and a copy of the student's learner's permit /license to the address listed below. The cost is \$470 for residents, \$490 for **non-residents.** The registration deadline for Session II will end January 21, 2022. Please select your drive groups, listing your choices in order of preference. First priority will be given to resident seniors, then resident juniors, then underclassmen and non-residents. Every effort will be made to accommodate your request. You will be notified by e-mail or telephone, and a list will be posted in the High School if you have been accepted and enrolled. If a registrant did not get into the session, they will be notified in writing and placed on a priority list for the next session.

Safe Driving Techniques (Five-Hour Course)

The NYS Bureau of Motor Vehicles requires five hours of classroom instruction as a prerequisite for obtaining a driver's license. Applicants affected by this regulation are those applying for a first-time driver's license; those applying for a driver's license because of a lapse of a one-year renewal grace period; and those applying for a new license as a result of revocation of a previous license. The five-hour training period must be completed prior to the applicant applying for a road test. Persons having completed a regular driving education course do NOT need this program.

The following regulations are applicable to all prospective registrants:

• Registration must be completed by mailing the registration form or in person at Oliver Middle School by noon the Tuesday immediately preceding the class. There is a seven-person minimum to hold this class. Registering on time reduces the risk of cancellation.

- Students will be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Applicants must be 16 years of age or older.
- Applicants must bring their valid learner's permit to register.
- Applicants must pay the \$40 registration fee upon registering and completely fill out the registration form.

An official completion certificate, which is valid for one year from the day of issuance, will be given upon completion of the five-hour program. This certificate must be presented when applying for a road test. It does not qualify participants for reduced insurance
